- a book symposium

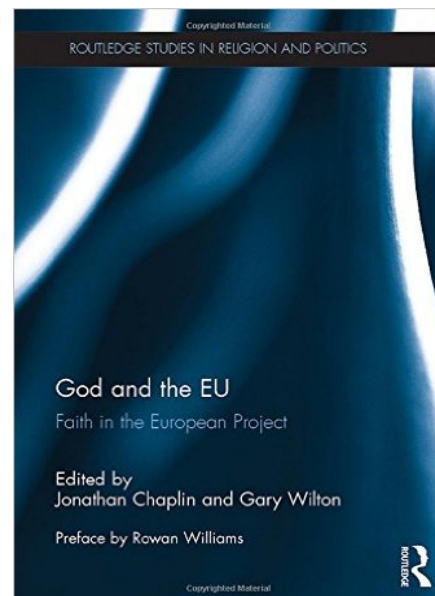
